



Voyageur Country ATV and Superior National Forest Recognized By USFS With Regional Awards

The Voyageur Country ATV club has received two awards from the Eastern Region of the U.S. Forest Service.

Volunteer and Service Award


Citizen Stewardship & Partnerships Category

This award is in recognition of recent OHV projects completed on the LaCroix Ranger District in the Superior National Forest, most notably the Vermilion River OHV Bridge and Trails, and Crane Lake to Vermilion Falls OHV Trail and Boardwalk Bridge projects that have been completed.

The award announcement reads, in part:

"Voyageur Country ATV has quickly become a valuable partner with the Superior National Forest for the planning, designing, and construction of Off-Highway Vehicle and All-Terrain Vehicle routes. With over 700 members it is the largest ATV club in the State of Minnesota. The entire club's efforts as volunteers on the National Forest was nominated and recognized."

The Forest Service awards process has two levels, at the region and nationally. It begins with nominations and recipients in each region and then it narrows down for the national level. The Superior National Forest is in the Eastern Region (Region 9), which includes National Forests in 13 states from Minnesota to Missouri and east to New Hampshire and West Virginia. Awards at the regional level are competitive and a worthy recognition.
