Registration Is Now Open For The ATV Minnesota State Convention (Ride & Rally) September 17-19 In Ely **Save The Dates!**





Catching Up On High Demand For ATV Safety Training Classes

Thanks to all the ATV clubs that are organizing ATV Safety Classes so young riders 12-15 can get their ATV Certificates.

COVID put a stop to classes last year. To catch up to the demand, more and more classes are being organized and listed on the DNR website; they fill up fast. The "MN DNR ENF Safety/Education COVID-19 Preparedness Plan" now allows 25 students/instructors outside, 25 inside. Parents who need their kids to take the hands-on rider course are encouraged to sign up for those still open, even

Spring Thaw Closes ATV Trails And

State/Federal Forest Roads

From a DNR News Release: The Minnesota Department of Natural Resources will temporarily close some state forest roads and trails because they are not firm enough to support vehicle traffic without causing damage. Depending on weather conditions, the temporary closures could remain in effect until sometime in May. "The annual spring thaw creates wet, unstable road and trail conditions," said Deb Pitt, roads program coordinator for the Minnesota DNR Forestry Division. "Seasonal closures protect these roads from damage. Before heading out, people should check the DNR website for updates, obey the closures, and use good judgment wherever they ride or drive."

Temporary road and trail closure information is updated weekly on Thursdays by 2 p.m. Signs will be posted at entry points and parking lots. Roads that can handle vehicle traffic during the spring thaw will

remain open but may have vehicle weight restrictions. For status of Federal Forest Roads, contact the Chippewa and Superior National Forests or see their websites.

Creating A Positive Future For Motorized Recreation In Minnesota



ATVMN Planning
For 2021 And Beyond
The annual ATV Minnesota
Vision Conference was held
March 20th at Running
Aces in Forest Lake. Fifty
people attended in person
or through Zoom for the
all-day, agenda-packed
meeting, including the
ATVMN Executive Board,
Regional Directors,
members, our lobbyists,

agency partners with the Minnesota DNR Parks & Trails and Enforcement

Divisions, two ATV manufacturers and the Big Air ATV Tour. Here are some of the highlights from the ATVMN 2021 Vision Conference:

- **-Bylaws:** Four areas were updated, to be voted on at the fall State Convention.
- **-Strategic Plan Update:** Discussion, with revisions made due to COVID, details will be provided to the state board in May for approval.
- **-ERX Motor Park:** There will be volunteer opportunities in June at the High Lifter Mud Nationals and in July at the ERX OffRoad National. Details to come.
- **-DNR Parks & Trails Update**: Record use of trails in 2020; improvements to GIA process/funding, progress on new trail projects and ATV camping.
- **-DNR Enforcement**: A report on 2020 accidents/fatalities, increase in citations for youths under 18 not wearing helmets; update on ATV safety training in 2021; new public service announcements in the works.
- **-Promoting Safety:** With the increase in new ATV registrations, Perry May presented innovative ideas for clubs to educate new riders at the local level.



-Legislative Update: Progress during current Legislative Session on bills to remove "low pressure tires" from the ATV Definition, fund trails, and a state-wide Master Plan; discussion on E-15, Clean Car Standards and other issues forthcoming.

-Master Plan Update: Objectives, process involved with club and member input.

-Communications Report: Success of Minnesota Wheelin and our partnership with Pro Print.

-Changing the ATV Definition: A presentation

by BRP and Polaris via Zoom was followed by discussion on the pros and cons of increasing the maximum weight in Minnesota's ATV Definition from 2,000 lb. to 3,000 lb., in order to 1) accommodate Class 2 ATVs with 4 seats and a cab, already over 2,000 lb., and 2) electric vehicles being introduced by manufacturers. A motion was voted on and passed by a narrow margin to 1) not oppose manufacturers' proposal to the State Legislature to increase the weight limit up to 3,000 pounds, 2) keep the maximum width at 65 inches, and 3) that no additional changes would be made for the next 5 years. ATVMN and its lobbyists will followup and monitor this important issue.

-Efforts to Grow Membership: Discussion included: over 300 new members this year, pilot project for ATVMN to manage membership for an ATV club with all-ATVMN members, new ATVMN and Minnesota Wheelin websites coming.

-ATV Big Air Tour: A preview of the show coming to our State Convention in September.

- **-Winter Riding Opportunities:** An update on our successful educational efforts.
- **-Regional Directors:** Review of those up for renewal, nominations and vote.

Watch for in-depth articles on many of these issues in future ATVMN newsletters and the Minnesota Wheelin magazine. At the annual Vision Conference, the ATV Minnesota Executive



Board, Regional Directors and ATV club members from across the state discuss a wide range of topics, with one goal: creating a clear Vision for ATVMN, and the Action Items needed to move it and its 70 member clubs forward, and advance our state's awesome ATV trail system.
