


# In Minnesota, ATV Trail Building (And Trail Riding) Are Year-Round

## From the Prospector Alliance:

There is some good progress to report on the Beaver River bridge, which is an important connector for the Prospector trail system. Deck materials are staged and big equipment is on site. 10,000 years of nature creating muck in this area means it's so deep there is no bottom. Helical piles are needed to create the columns required to support the bridge. These are screwed into the muck until there is enough resistance to say it can hold the weight required. The piles near the river are 28 ft deep while the others are averaging 22 ft deep. Tops of the

columns will have some screw-jack threaded ends to adjust the bridge level in the future as needed. If all goes as planned the bridge should be done this spring.

President Larry Folstad and Frank Sever of Sever Dirt Works cleared the Chisholm ATV Trail and Chisholm Sportsmen's Club this week for the 2022 Chisholm Polar Bear Days ATV Ride, February 26th. # MN Valley ATV Riders Disbands (Donates \$3,000 to ATV MN)

In late November of 2021, I received notice from
the MN Valley ATV Riders that they made the
difficult decision to disband the club. Located in
the Renville and Redwood County area, the club
held many of its meetings in Belview. I had the
chance to attend some of their meetings in the
past (see photo) and found an active group of
members that promoted ATV recreation, held

fun ride events, and were in the middle of a struggle to build an Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) park in Sacred Heart Township of Renville County. In the early years of the club, around 2009, almost 200 members were signing on to help design, construct, and maintain a new OHV park. They engaged local Legislators and found early support from Renville County Commissioners. They worked with the Minnesota DNR, applied for Federal Recreational

Trails Program (RTP) funds, and matching funds from the ATV Dedicated Account and Grant-in-Aid.

In 2012, a 272-acre parcel of land was identified, and the due-diligence work of engineering, environmental and archeological studies was started. Future steps included the formal appraisal and purchase of the land, and moving into the construction phase. In January of 2018, the club hit a major obstacle. The Renville County Board voted to table any future discussions regarding the OHV park, which basically stopped local government support for it. The once active club began bleeding members. Seven years of attending meetings, gaining business, community, and local government support were all lost during a single County Board meeting. Since 2018, the club has tried, without success, to revive the project and as a result club membership continued to diminish, until it was time to disband.



### **Trails Give Clubs A Firm Identity**

As the ATV MN State Director, I have watched this scenario play out before. Clubs form an identity around a trail that they help design, construct and maintain. In essence, the club members see themselves as the stewards of that trail. This stewardship drives membership. A trail is something that members, businesses, and communities rally around. No Clubs – No Trails – No Sales.

We have a large issue in this state regarding membership. Less than 5% of Minnesota's registered-ATV owners are club members or members in ATV MN. There are now over 342,000 registered ATVs in the State. To change the trajectory of building more trails in more areas, we simply need more members. It remains one of the critical issues and challenges for ATV MN.

One of the last orders of business for the MN Valley ATV Riders, before voting to disband, was an act of grace, donating \$3,000 to ATV MN in

memory of a young man named Nicholas Scott Warner. Nick lost his life at the age of 16, because of an ATV roll-over accident, in a ravine on an unmarked trail. Nick's parents and grandparents donated money to the club in the hopes of building the new OHV park in Renville County. They believed in providing safe and sustainable trails and riding areas for all people to enjoy. This is a reminder for our organization and its member clubs, regarding the continued focus on building safe, sustainable, and fun trails throughput the entire state of Minnesota, while promoting the need for safety education and skills training for all rider age groups. # Reeling In A Cool Community Connection

Single-digit temperatures and a
6:30 a.m. outdoor Saturday
morning meeting in Nisswa,
Minn, was just the start of the
day for twenty-two club
members of the Central Lakes
and Cuyuna Iron Range Riders
ATV Clubs. Darrel Palmer, ATV
MN Northeast Regional
Director, and Grant
Coordinator for the Central
Lakes Club, leads the
discussion outlining plans to

keep 9,000 people inside a square-shaped perimeter road that marks the boundary for the annual Brainerd Ice Fishing Extravaganza, held on Gull Lake, and organized by the Brainerd Jaycees since 1991. This is the largest ice-fishing tournament in the world and brings in people from all over the United States and the world. The Jaycees give away \$150,000 in prizes, and proceeds go to local charities. About 18,000 holes were drilled in the ice for the contestants. Food and ice fishing vendors, along with dozens of porta-potties were just a few additions that made for a small town on ice.

Starting in 2009, the Jaycees reached out to Darrel to see if their club would help with the event. Kevin Kiehlbauch, Central Lakes Club President, and Russ Heittola, Grant Coordinator for the Cuyuna Iron Range Riders, joined Darrel as lead organizers from the two clubs. At approximately 7 a.m. the volunteers leave with their vehicles and ATVs in tow to drive onto a plowed parking area on the ice. Once unloaded, there was work to be done. Each ATV received a security sign, and was placed in a team of four, to monitor and secure one of the four quadrants of the perimeter road. Banners and signs needed to be put up directing ice fishing contestants to four checkpoints. The contest runs from 12 noon to 3 p.m. Contestants begin checking in as early as 8 a.m. to get to what they believe will be the lucky hole.



Schools buses were lined up on the highway as far as the eye could see, dropping off fishermen and their gear. People also drove their vehicles onto the ice from various access points, and local resorts shuttled people out, pulling large trailers full of people. By noon all the contestants were inside the perimeter, and a gun sounded to start the contest. The job of the volunteers now

shifted to security and keeping any people coming from the outside of the perimeter into the

tournament area. The ATVs were in constant motion patrolling the perimeter. Darrel, Kevin and Russ came by to relieve volunteers, which provided a break in the warming tent, and to get some lunch. Daytime temperatures warmed into the low twenties, and the breeze calmed, which provided nice fishing conditions. A large 12 ft x 19 ft Jumbotron displayed the current results of the contest. At 3 p.m., the gun sounded again to end the tournament. A total of 750 fish were registered during the 3-hour event. A 9.15 lb northern pike and 4.98 lb walleye took the top prizes.

I was a rookie volunteer for the day to observe the efforts the two clubs put in to make this a successful event. I felt a sense of pride helping and got the sense all the volunteers felt the same way. That's probably the reason they return each year to do it all again. Darrel commented that this is one way the two clubs help the local community, knowing the proceeds are going to local charitable causes. It goes a long way to improving our image as ATV riders. The Jaycees benefit from the volunteer work and, in turn, make a cash donation back to clubs for their help. Thank you to all the Central Lakes and Cuyuna Iron Range Riders ATV Club volunteers for their "cool" community connection...ATV MN proud!



# Miller Black Bear Trail To Expand By 12.5 Miles From the Brainerd Dispatch

The Crow Wing County Board approved the expansion project plan for Miller Black Bear Trail and granted an amended motorized multi-use trail permit to the Cuyuna Iron Range Riders ATV Club during its Tuesday,

Jan. 25, meeting.

The trail — which currently covers 20 miles through Wolford and Irondale townships along with the city of Trommald — traverses through county- and state-managed forestlands and is open to ATVs, off-highway motorcycles and all non-motorized recreational uses. Along the route, trail users may visit scenic overlooks of the Mississippi River along with six sites furnished with picnic tables and grills. The southern parking area is located along a mine pit lake, which provides trout fishing opportunities.

Of the 12.5 miles to be added to the system, half will be newly constructed trails, while the other half will use existing undesignated and unmanaged forest trails already open to ATV use. The expansion area covers 1,220 acres of county-managed land and 80 acres of land managed by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, including a 427-foot section and a 53-foot section crossing wetlands. These sections will include elevated boardwalks, which are not considered wetland impacts, per the Wetlands Conservation Act of Minnesota. 


# **Remembering A Fun Club Event**
