Removing windfalls, replacing culverts, repairing bridges, hauling gravel. They give it their best, as always, then make the tough decision to open trails to the riding public in early May or keep them closed a little longer to dry out and make sure they are safe for the riding public. ### Monitoring Trails...and Walleyes

(Prospector and Voyageur Country trails added to far-north options for DNR-certified Trail Ambassadors)

Mike Banovetz is a new Trail Ambassador. He lives in Ely and is the first TA with the Prospector ATV Club. TAs must ride in twos when monitoring trails, so another newly certified TA, Mike Harcey with the Woodtick Wheelers ATV Club, is going to make the 4-1/2 hour drive from his home in Jordan up to Ely to help out.

The two Mikes are going to monitor the trails from Ely to the Greenstone fire area (Stoney loop), stop in Babbitt for lunch, then head back to Ely across the new Beaver River bridge. The next day, they are going fishing.

Over 200 Trail Ambassadors will be monitoring the State ATV Trails this year.

As shown in the table, they have plenty of choices, including the Prospector and Voyageur Country ATV trail systems, added this year. In case your club's TAs want to be like the Mikes and try some new routes, one option is to ride the trails in St. Louis County's deep woods, then jump in a boat and enjoy a day on the lake.
