We've been talking about this project for quite some and here it is!


The Minnesota ATV Statewide Strategic Plan (aka Master Plan) will

identify strategies to enhance the ATV program of the Minnesota DNR, and address the growing demand for ATV riding opportunities, while also considering the long-term environmental and financial impacts of trail development. Plan recommendations will be informed by a thorough existing-conditions assessment, multiple public-engagement sessions, and a robust statewide spatial analysis that incorporates social, environmental, and infrastructure data.

The final plan will include:

- Trail inventory and existing system audit
- ATV-user trends analysis
- Maintenance and funding recommendations to ensure future trail viability
- Economic impact estimates of ATV activity in Minnesota
- Sustainable trail development recommendations
- Trail development and connectivity opportunity analysis
- Program, policy, and process recommendations

Planning For 2022 And Beyond: Vision Conference Highlights

The annual ATV Minnesota Vision Conference was held April 23-24, 2022, at the Holiday Inn, Detroit Lakes, Minn. Fifty people attended in-person or through Zoom for the Saturday meeting, including the ATV MN Executive Board, Regional Directors, members, our lobbyists, agency partners with Minnesota DNR Parks & Trails and Enforcement Divisions. Also attending were two representatives of SE GROUP, the consulting team working with the DNR and ATV MN on a new State ATV Master Plan.

At the annual Vision Conference, all stakeholders are invited to discuss a wide range of topics, with one goal: creating a clear Vision for ATV MN, and the Action Items needed to move it and its 65 member clubs forward, and advance our state's awesome ATV trail system.

Here is a recap of the topics discussed:

Strategic Plan Update — Ron Potter, ATV MN president, reviewed the Strategic Plan with the clubs in attendance, including its main Objectives and Critical Issues:

- More riding opportunities Utilizing the new Statewide Master Plan.
- Adequate & timely funding Improving GIA, its training, identify funding options.
- Expertise in trail development and maintenance Providing training for clubs and land managers, promoting training materials, developing Trail Management Objectives.
- Rider behavior Promoting rider education beyond providing the DNR reg book.
- ATV owners not with ATV MN Identify and reach out to non-members, create a corporate sponsor program for OEMs and dealers, identify under-represented groups, develop a youth association for future leaders, promote membership benefits.
- Volunteerism Clubs vary in success, identify what works to boost volunteering.
- Trails within road right-of-way Work with road authorities to develop possible design options for trails where R/W is needed for success of the trail system.
- Open trails and Forest Roads Tackling a variety of issues related to use and maintenance.
- Adequate and sustained funding Develop a multi-year financial plan, create additional revenue streams to meet goals of the ATV MN Strategic Plan.

Corporate Sponsor Program — A program was presented that would invite manufacturers, dealers, businesses and clubs to sponsor ATV MN annually, with specific benefits for 5 sponsor tiers.

Legislative Update — ATV MN lobbyists Ray Bohn and Tom Hackbarth updated the clubs on the progress of various bills at the State Legislature during the current Session.



DNR Enforcement — Bruce Lawrence reported on ATV Safety Training data, 2021 accident numbers, stats for the Trail Ambassador program, and an update on new public safety announcements, the next reg book and trail atlas. Watch for future newsletters with more details on these programs.

ATV MN Safety Committee — By unanimous vote, a new committee was created to focus on promoting ATV safety messages, events and activities, working with the DNR, manufacturers and rider groups to seek solutions to reduce ATV incidents.



Minnesota ATV Master Plan — Annaka Egan (left in photo) and Ayden Eickhoff, a consultant team with SE GROUP, introduced everyone to the Minnesota ATV Statewide Strategic Plan (aka Master Plan), its objectives, process and timing. It's now underway, with the SE GROUP working with the Minnesota DNR and ATV Minnesota. A visioning exercise was held during the meeting, with groups of riders sharing their experiences, and hopes for the future of ATV riding in Minnesota. ATV MN Communications — The comm team updated its progress over the past year, improving communications with members and recruiting new members through new websites, a twice-monthly newsletter, social media and, with the help of our publishing partners at Pro Print, the new Minnesota Wheelin magazine; thanks to Creston and Ali for attending by Zoom to give us their thoughts on year one of our partnership.



DNR Parks & Trails — Those attending got to meet the current and some of the new P&T staffers they will be working with on the GIA program and other issues. Joe Unger, OHV Program Consultant, updated the group on improvements to the GIA program, manual, forms and club reimbursements. Winter Riding — The committee tackling this issue gave an update on current winter riding

opportunities, and ATV MN progress to work through existing barriers to create new ATV-only trails and riding opportunities during winter months.

State Director Report — Perry May reviewed his work, connecting with 75% of the 65 clubs during 2021, and reported on their concerns and priorities moving forward. He also discussed the habits of healthy and active ATV clubs across the state. See his full report below.



Sunday Board Meeting — The monthly meeting of the ATV MN board was held in-person at the hotel Sunday morning, tackling a long list of programs and issues on behalf of its members and clubs.
